Introduction



Welcome to the ELT *Rewound* Visual Story. This visual story has been provided to help all audience members know what to expect before they see the show.

The Show

Rewound is a variety show presented by young people aged 9-25 years from the Electric Light Theatre group.

It will run for two hours with an interval. There will be 19 sections. Each section has a different theme.

The performers will be singing, dancing and acting.

The Venue

The show will be held at the Mildura Arts Centre in the main theatre.

You may like to bring some things from home to comfort you whilst you are watching the

performance.

You can bring your cuddle toys, noise cancelling headphones or something to help you enjoy the theatre.

Drinks and food are allowed in the theatre



Outside the Theatre



When you arrive at the theatre, you might wait outside in the grassed area. There are some other buildings, a driveway, and some sculptures. To get to the theatre, you go in the glass doors.



Inside the Foyer

The foyer is where people wait until they can go into the theatre. You can sit at the tables and chairs. You might collect your tickets from the box office or go to the toilet. Sometimes people buy food and drinks. There will be a chiming sound when it's time to go

In the Theatre



The usher will look at your tickets and help you to find your seats. Everyone will wait in their

seats for the show to start. When the show starts it will get dark. If you need to go out of the theatre during the show, the usher will help you to find your way with their torch.



Opening



When it's time for the show to start, the lights in the audience area will go off and it will be dark. When the lights go down, the audience are expected to be quiet. There will be a very short video of an Electric Light globe with a flickering light and a creaking noise. All the performers will come onto the stage. There will be recorded music, dancing and singing. It might be quite loud. You will hear parts of three songs, *Shut Up and Dance with Me, I Wanna Dance with Somebody* and *Raise your Glass*. When the scene is finished, it is time to clap and cheer.



Time Machine



Two actors pretending to be Doc and Marty will

come onto the stage. They will have a pretend time machine and pretend that they are travelling in time. They will talk and make jokes. The audience might laugh during this scene. When the actors finish the scene it is time for the audience to clap.



Hamilton



This scene tells a short part of the story from

Hamilton, the musical. There will be recorded music in this scene. The scene starts with three actors rapping. More performers will come on stage to do a dance. Two actors pretend to have a gun battle and the actor playing Hamilton pretends to die. There will be a loud explosion sound effect and red light and the stage will go dark at the end. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Chitty Chitty Bang Bang



This scene tells a short part of the story from Chitty Chitty Bang Bang, the musical. There is recorded music in this scene. The scene starts

with some actors in a pretend car. There is a loud car sound effect. More performers come on stage to do a dance. A new group of dancers enter the stage with sticks. They use the sticks to tap the ground, throw and jump over as part of the dance. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Joyful Joyful




This scene is a performance of the song *Joyful Joyful*. Three singers start the song with no recorded music. The recorded music will start

and the other singers will join in. You might like to clap along with the song. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Backstreet Thrill



This scene is a performance of the songs, *Thriller* and *Everybody*. There is recorded music in the scene. There will be singing and dancing for the whole scene. There will be someone pretending to be a zombie, a werewolf and other scary characters in this scene. They are not real. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Time Machine/1984



The two actors pretending to be Doc and Marty

come back onto the stage. They have a pretend time machine and pretend that they have travelled back in time to 1984. They will talk and make jokes. The audience might laugh during this scene. Lots of people come on stage to dance and sing a mash up of songs from the eighties. When the scene finishes, it is time for the audience to clap.



Ballroom



This scene is a performance of the song *Brother*, by Matt Corby. There is recorded music in this scene. A line of singers will stand at the back of the stage and sing the song. A group of

dancers do ballroom dancing. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Doctor's Office



A group of actors pretending to be in a doctor's waiting room will come on stage. They will talk and make jokes. The audience might laugh during this scene. There will be some loud pretend sneezes. When the actors finish the scene, it is time for the audience to clap.



Barbie Land



This scene tells a short part of the story from *Barbie*, the movie. There will be recorded music for most of this scene. This is a noisy, bright, colourful scene. There is a recorded voice telling some of the story.

Some actors will pretend to be different Barbies to a song called *Pink*, by Lizzo. The music will stop and the actors pretend to be on the beach. The group will dance to the song, Dance the Night Away. The actor pretending to be Ken will sing the song *I'm Just Ken*. The whole group will dance to *Barbie Dreams*. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Interval



There will be a break in the show called *interval*. The lights will come back on in the audience. You can choose to stay in the theatre, or go out for a break. If you stay in the theatre there will be a slideshow of past ELT shows on the sidescreens. If you go out of the theatre you can go to the toilet, buy something to eat or go outside. When it is time to go back in to watch the rest of the show, there will be a sound of chiming bells. The audience will go inside and sit back down.The lights in the audience will go dark.



Moulin Rouge



This scene tells a short part of the story from *Moulin Rouge,* the musical. There will be recorded music for this scene. At the start of the scene there will be a man wearing a top hat with a very loud voice. There will be lots of performers wearing different colourful costumes. There is singing, dancing and acting for the whole scene. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Six



This scene is a song called *ExWives* from Six, the musical. There will be recorded music in this scene. Six female performers will pretend to be the 6 wives of King Henry the Eighth. The six performers will sing and dance for the whole song. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Grease



This scene is a song called Summer Nights from

Grease, the musical. There will be recorded music in this scene. The main characters in this scene are called Danny and Sandy Two groups take turns to sing, act and dance to tell the story of the song. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Pirates of Penzance



This scene is four songs from a musical called The *Pirates of Penzance*. There is recorded music in this scene. The performers will pretend to be dancing pirates and dancing police. There are some pretend fights, then the pirates scare off the police, and the Pirate King celebrates. The singing in this scene is very fast and might be a little hard to understand. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Time Machine



The two actors pretending to be Doc and Marty come back onto the stage with their pretend time machine. A little while into the scene a third actor joins them. They talk and make jokes. The audience might laugh during this scene. When the actors finish the scene it is time for the audience to clap.



Concrete Shuffle



This scene starts with just tap dancing. After a while some recorded music starts as well. The

tap dancing is quite loud. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Toy Story/Inside Out



This scene is a story about characters from T*oy Story and Inside Out*. The Inside Out characters appear in Toy Story World. There is a lot of talking in this scene. There will be some loud sounds, like screaming and crying. There are some loud sound effects and lots of people dressed as familiar characters. After a dance, the scene finishes and the audience will clap.



Masterpiece



This scene is a performance of the song

Masterpiece. A recording of the song will play and a group of performers will dance. When the scene finishes, the audience will clap.



Time Machine/Millionaire Hot Seat



Two actors off to the side of the stage pretend to be on a quiz show. After they finish, the two actors pretending to be Doc and Marty will come back onto the stage with their time machine. They talk and make jokes. The audience might laugh during this scene. When the actors finish the scene, it is time for the audience to clap.



Finale



This is the last scene of the show. All the performers will come onto the stage. There will be songs with recorded music, dancing and singing. You will hear parts of three songs, *Older, Something that I Want,* and *We Still Like You.* The audience might clap and sing along. When the scene is finished it is time to clap and cheer. The actors will bow and the audience might stand up to clap, call out and cheer.



End of the Show



When the clapping has finished the curtain comes down and the lights will come on in the audience. There will be some special presentations given to some of the performers after this. Audience members can choose whether or not they want to stay for these presentations.



After the Show



After the show has finished the audience come back out to the foyer and outside the theatre. Sometimes the performers come out into the foyer to talk with the audience. Then it is time to leave. The show is finished.
